ANNUAL** REPORT 2024







Children's Cancer Connection began as a standalone oncology camp in June 1988. Thirty-seven years later, **CCC** has grown to now offer nearly 60 programs to 871 lowa families — all free of charge. None of this would have been possible without the support of generous donors, like YOU!

2024 was a difficult year for many non-profits and we are proud of how **CCC** successfully navigated the difficult economic climate and changes that came our way. Donations were somewhat lower than expected, but as responsible stewards of our donations we adjusted our expenses to match our income and ended the year with a small \$1,000 deficit (due primarily to unrealized investment losses). Our small but mighty staff team of nine navigated changes throughout the year too. Three staff members left CCC for opportunities for advancement or to spend more time with their family and we welcomed new members to the team. Three staff members welcomed new babies to their families and utilized our parental leave as well as our babies at work program, where new parents can bring their babies with them to work until they reach 6 months of age. Through all these challenges and changes, we focused on our mission and ensured that our programs and camps continued.

Teen Programs continue to grow, with **Exploration Expedition and Teen Camps reaching full capacity (and having waitlists!).** Family programs and support programs have expanded to offer **Fall Family Outings in both Central and Eastern Iowa,** and **monthly Kids Club and Teen Hangout programs have also increased in attendance.**

CCC's Jeff and Deb Hansen Home for Hope facility in Johnston provides a bright, cheerful and accessible space for many of our programs. The **outdoor inclusive playground, sport court and Gold Ribbon Walkway** have quickly become a popular space for children and teens to gather for outdoor recreation while forming connections with others on their cancer journey.

CCC currently serves families in **79** of lowa's **99** counties, and it is a goal to serve everyone that is living, treated or diagnosed with pediatric cancer in the state. We have **established new strategic partnerships with hospitals and nonprofit organizations within and beyond state borders** to ensure these families are informed about CCC and the support services we provide.

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
